
# Le Mans 24-Hour Race 100th Anniversary Gets into Gear at Fuji Motorsports Museum

Series of Events Featuring Drivers, Toyota Le Mans Racecars, and more Begins June 9

Furthering its mission of celebrating motorsports history, Fuji Motorsports Museum, which opened this past October, is pleased to present a special exhibition: "100th Anniversary of the Le Mans 24-Hour Race: Passion of People Fascinated by the Sarthe."



The exhibition begins June 9, 2023 (Friday) and features a special display of Toyota's Le Mans cars, special talks by drivers who competed in the race, along with photo panels showing the excitement of Le Mans in the late 1960s.

	will be open to the public only for this limited time.



## 2. Fireside Chat Sessions: Le Mans, the Enchanting Circuit de la Sarthe



(1) Discussion featuring Hiroshi Fushida and Masanori Sekiya

When: June 10, 2023 (Saturday) 16:00 - 17:00
Overview: Listen to the experiences of Japanese pioneer Hiroshi
Fushida discuss participation in the 1970s, when Japanese teams began competing in Le Mans, and hear from Masanori
Sekiya, who followed in his footsteps and later became the first Japanese driver to win a top podium finish in 1995.



(2) Discussion featuring Ukyo Katayama, Toshio Suzuki, and Keiichi Tsuchiya

When: June 30, 2023 (Friday) 16:00 - 17:00

Overview: In 1999, TS020 (Car #3) chased the top position with only a few laps remaining, but suffered a tire burst and finished in 2nd place. The three drivers who achieved this feat will talk passionately about their experiences in front of the actual car.
